The abat E-Invoicing Monitor

The smart alternative for cost-effective
electronic invoicing

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The era of e-invoicing is here: Starting January 1, 2027, German companies will be required to send electronic invoices in the B2B sector almost without exception. A corresponding legal obligation for recipients has been in effect since January 2025. There are several solutions on the market, but most of them come with high ongoing costs. Not so with the abat E-Invoicing Monitor: Here, only one-time implementation costs apply.

In this white paper, we would like to provide you with an overview of the legal framework and demonstrate how our dashboard makes the transition easy and allows you to send e-invoices cost-effectively.



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Definition of e-invoicing & legal framework

The electronic invoice has its origins in European legislation. The primary basis is the EU Directive EN 2014/55/EU. This directive aims to standardize the previously numerous interoperable standards. Across Germany, the regulations were implemented under the E-Invoicing Act in conjunction with the E-Invoicing Ordinance. Accordingly, sending e-invoices to federal public contracting authorities (B2G) has been mandatory since November 2020. The federal states have also enacted their own laws on this matter.

Invoices must be issued and transmitted in electronic form. All formats that comply with EN 2014/55/EU are permitted. The legislature defines an e-invoice as a structured format, i.e., XML. Image-based files such as PDFs, which could also be considered electronic invoices, are not recognized. In addition to purely structured formats (e.g., XRechnung), hybrid formats such as ZUGFeRD are also permitted. In the hybrid approach, the XML is embedded in a human-readable file.

With the Growth Opportunities Act passed by the German federal government, e-invoicing is also becoming mandatory in the business-to-business (B2B) sector. As of January 1, 2025, every German company must be able to receive electronic invoices. Sending e-invoices, in turn, will become mandatory in phases:



Paper invoices may continue to be sent until **the end of 2026**. The same applies to electronic formats that do not meet the requirements for e-invoicing. In this case, so-called “other invoices” may still be sent. These include invoices issued in a format other than the EU standard or on paper.

Starting January 1, 2027, companies with a previous year’s turnover exceeding €800,000 must send electronic invoices to B2B customers. Companies whose turnover in the previous year was less than €800,000 may continue to issue paper and PDF invoices for the time being.

Starting in 2028, all domestic companies must send e-invoices.

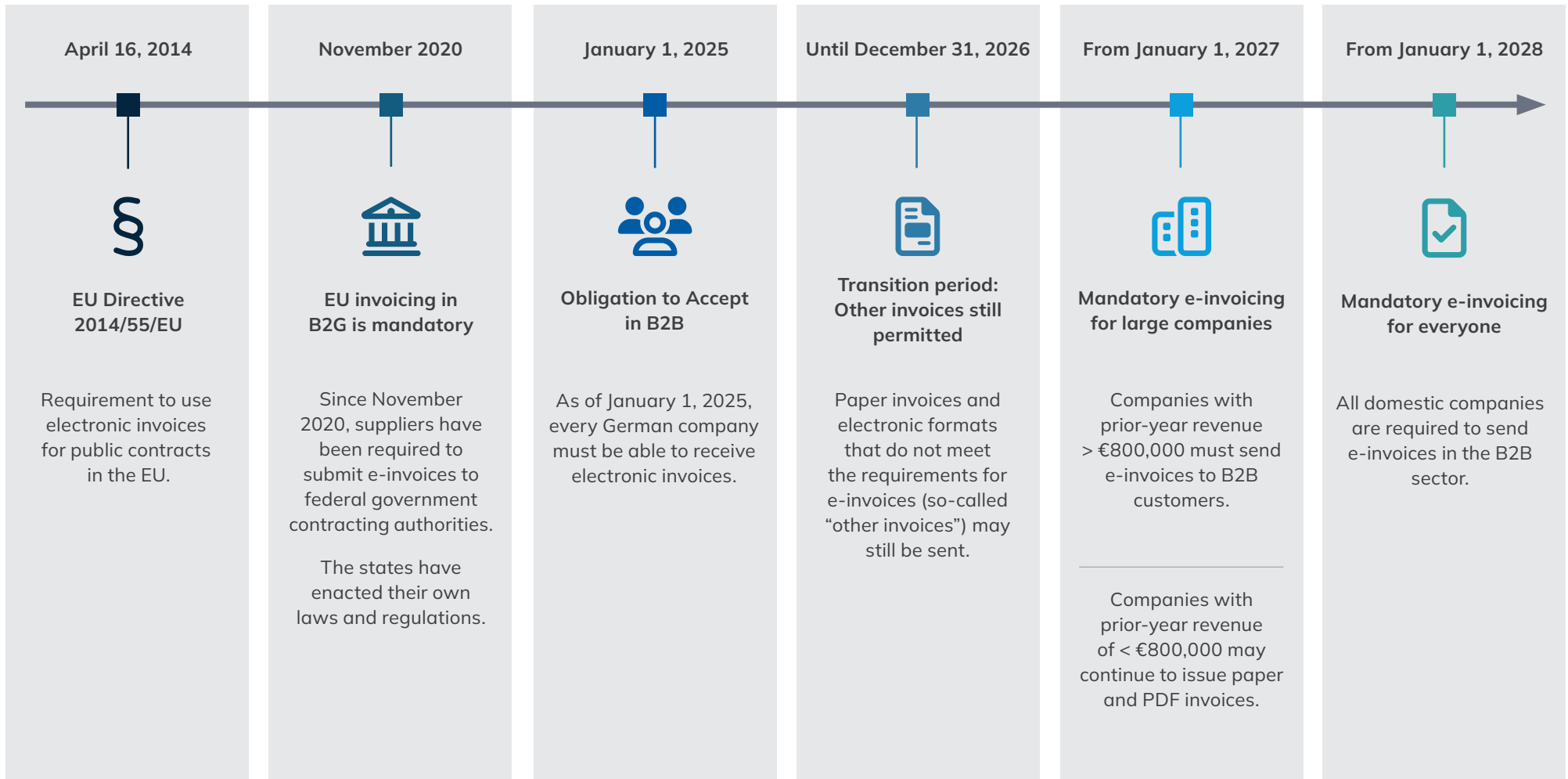
There are hardly any exceptions to these requirements:

- Small amounts (up to €250)
- Tickets/travel passes
- Tax-exempt transactions
- Exemption for small businesses (Section 19 of the German Value-Added Tax Act)

EDI procedures widely used in practice, such as EDIFACT, remain generally permissible. Until the end of next year, the standards used to date may be retained without changes. As of January 1, 2028, these invoices must comply with the criteria of EN 2014/55/EU.

An overview

The introduction of mandatory e-invoicing in Germany is not a sudden change, but rather the result of a regulatory process that has spanned several years. As early as 2014, the EU laid the groundwork with Directive 2014/55/EU by making electronic invoicing mandatory in public procurement. Since then, lawmakers have gradually extended the requirement to the B2B sector, with clearly defined phases leading up to full mandatory implementation for all domestic companies starting in 2028.

To overcome the legal challenges outlined above, choosing the right tool and partner is crucial. Numerous solutions are available on the market. However, these come with corresponding licensing and maintenance costs. This often poses significant challenges, especially for small and medium-sized enterprises.

SAP offers the product SAP Document and Reporting Compliance (DRC). For the specific use cases of German customers, SAP DRC, Cloud Edition is required. This is a cloud service hosted by SAP on the BTP (Business Technology Platform) for managing electronic documents. License fees are charged based on the number of documents sent.

Our dashboard, on the other hand, is available without recurring costs. Only one-time implementation costs apply. Technologically, our cockpit is based on SAP modules and standard Customizing. As with DRC, invoices are generated in the SAP SD or FI module. The e-invoices are then automatically generated in the background using SAP AIF.

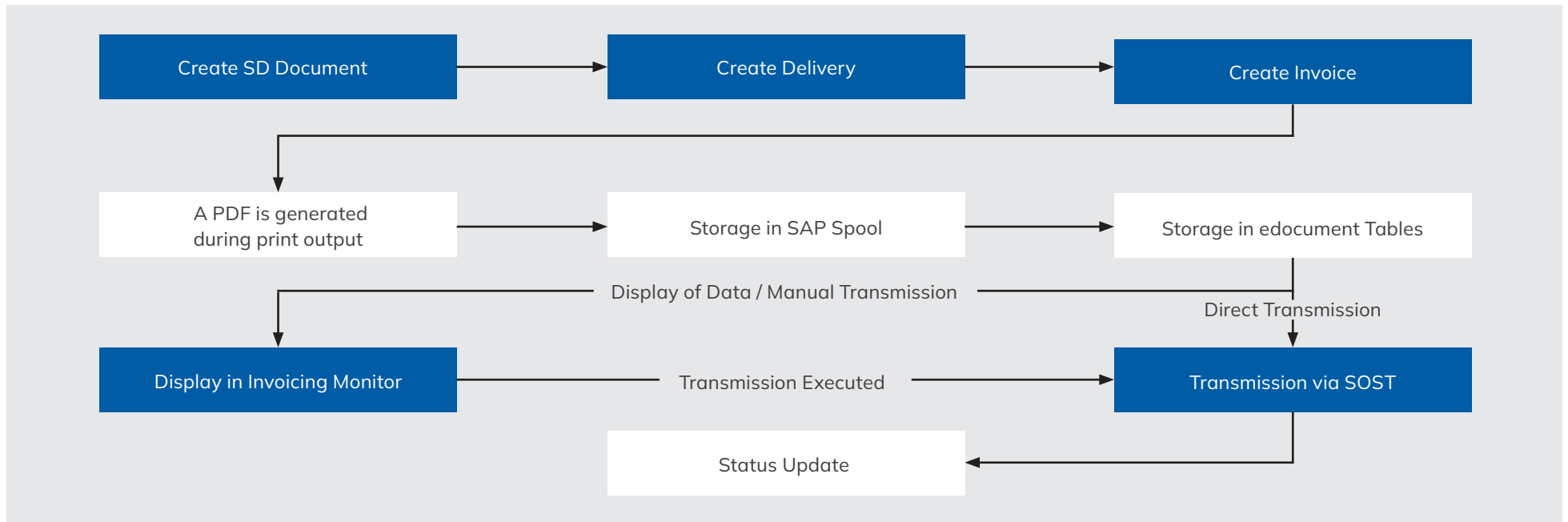
The abat E-Invoicing Monitor is available for comprehensive invoice management. For example, it allows users to preview documents before sending them. Unlike the DRC, the abat E-Invoicing Monitor was designed not from an IT perspective, but from the perspective of the business department.

Accordingly, it offers significantly more fields, including information on payment settlement and customer numbers. Additionally, users can jump to the associated documents or transactions (e.g., in the Business Partner). An automatic cancellation feature is also provided. This allows the eDocument and the corresponding source document to be canceled using a “one-click function.”

A common requirement is the inclusion of additional invoice fields. Extensions to include these fields, such as the EAN number or supplementary invoice texts, can be easily accommodated provided that legal regulations permit it.

Process flow from creation to delivery of an e-invoice

The transmission of all domestic and international formats is carried out via email using standard message control. Furthermore, background processing of documents is also possible. For DRC, the transmission channel varies depending on the format. There is no legal requirement regarding the transmission medium.

Our solution is available for both ERP and SAP S/4 HANA. The interface can be used both as a classic transaction in the SAP GUI and as an app in the Fiori Launchpad. Since the abat E-Invoicing Monitor is based on the SAP standard, patches (e.g., new versions of XRechnung) can be easily applied by implementing SAP Notes in the system. Accordingly, no extensive maintenance is required.

In addition to the two products, DRC and our Cockpit, a combination may also be appropriate under certain circumstances. Some EU countries, such as France, require the additional transmission of invoice data to a government platform. In this case, the DRC should be used as a certified provider. Since we store e-invoices in the standard database table EDOCUMENT, the abat E-Invoicing Monitor can, of course, be used as a comprehensive dashboard for all invoice formats.
